I plan on using Carrollo Engineers to review and comment on the subject report. This firm happens to be number one on our SOQ for waste water treatment plant design and I believe that they are competent for the task. I have called the firm and left word for them to call me.

I want to clarify a point ----- plant odors and their affects on the surrounding proposed residential development seems to be at the forefront. However there are other issues such as safe buffers around hazardous materials that are or may be in use at the plant.
